

In the 1920's, a group of thugs and bullies arose in Germany. They called themselves national socialists. They were indeed nationalist, but hardly socialist. One of their slogans was, "Make Germany Great Again."

National, in German, is spelled just as in English, but it is pronounced as if it were spelled *Nazional*. And these thugs and bullies became known, for short, as *Nazis*.

My parents both served in the armed forces during World War II. They helped to defeat the Not-sees. This was patriotic.

Now there are those in this country who want to adopt the ways of the Not-sees. They think that they are patriotic. They are not. They are traitors to their country and they are traitors to the human race, and if they are allowed to succeed, they will destroy this country as they destroyed Germany. They do not see that if you hate Americans, you hate America, because America is all of us.
